NOTICE

SOP FOR EXIT PROCESS AND LATERAL ENTRY INTO 7TH SEMESTER FYUGP

1. Students seeking to **exit** after successfully completing six semesters of study under FYUGP in Jagannath Barooah University shall follow the procedure given below:
 - a. Students must submit an application about their willingness to exit the programme to the Head, of the Major Department or HOD i/c, with attached copy of 6th semester grade sheet as evidence of successful completion;
 - b. The application, once forwarded by the HOD or HOD i/c, must be submitted to the Academic Registrar;
 - c. The application will be sent forward to the Controller of Examinations for issue of the official Undergraduate Bachelor's Degree certificate in the relevant Major subject.
2. In all cases of **student migration** involving admission to the 3rd, 5th, or 7th Semester of Undergraduate Programmes under the Multiple Entry-Exit and Horizontal Mobility provisions of NEP-2020, whether,
 - a. from one programme to another within Jagannath Barooah University, or
 - b. from one institution to another:

The admission/migration process in such cases shall be undertaken mandatorily and exclusively through the Lateral Entry Portal hosted at assamadm-le.samarth.ac.in, subject to the applicable provisions governing lateral entry and mobility.

3. Lateral entry into the 4th year (7th semester) of FYUGP will be possible only for students who have completed three years of the FYUGP course with Major in any HEI other than Jagannath Barooah University and have earned a minimum 132 credits.
4. Students with less than 132 credits will not be eligible for lateral entry into the 4th year (7th semester) of FYUGP owing to mismatch with the FYUGP curriculum being followed by Jagannath Barooah University, which carries 22 credits per semester and totals 176 credits in eight semesters.
5. However, such students, who have completed six semesters and earned a minimum of 120 credits from other HEIs shall be eligible to apply for **admission** into the **two-year Self-Financing Post Graduate Programme** being offered by selected departments of Jagannath Barooah University, based on merit criteria detailed in the University Prospectus, 2026-27 and available on the Jagannath Barooah University website: <https://jbu.ac.in>.
